#### **Disaster Programs for Drought**

- Animals and Livestock
- Conservation
- Crops and Plants
- Loans





# Livestock Forage Program (LFP)

LFP provides payments to eligible:

- livestock owners and contract growers who have covered livestock, and
- producers of grazed forage crop acreage (native and improved pasture land with permanent vegetative cover or certain crops planted specifically for grazing) that have suffered a loss of grazed forage due to a qualifying drought during the normal grazing period for the county.



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# Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP)

LIP provides provide benefits to eligible livestock owners or contract growers for livestock deaths in excess of normal mortality caused by eligible loss conditions, including:

- eligible adverse weather,
- eligible disease
- eligible wild animal attacks by animals



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#### **Emergency Conservation Program (ECP)**

The Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) provides emergency funding and technical assistance to farmers and ranchers to rehabilitate farmland damaged by natural disasters and to implement emergency water conservation measures in periods of severe drought.

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#### Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP)

NAP provides financial assistance to producers of non-insurable crops to protect against natural disasters that result in lower yields or crop losses, or prevents crop planting.



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# **Tree Assistance Program (TAP)**

Tree Assistance Program (TAP) provides financial assistance to eligible orchardists and nursery tree growers to replant or rehabilitate eligible trees, bushes, and vines lost by natural disasters.



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#### Wildfire, Hurricane Indemnity Program Plus (WHIP+)

WHIP+ provides payments to eligible producers who suffered eligible crop, tree, bush, vine, or prevented planting losses resulting from hurricanes, floods, tornadoes, typhoons, volcanic activity, snowstorms, wildfires, drought, and excessive moisture that occurred in the 2018 and 2019 calendar years.



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# **Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP)**

#### **Goal: Relief for producers impacted by COVID-19**

Provides direct payments to producers of eligible commodities

- Addresses price declines and supply chain disruptions, and additional marketing costs
- 80% of eligible payment now
- Apply from May 26, 2020 August 28, 2020
- No fee to apply
- Payments are not loans and do not have to be repaid (unless there is error or fraud). Payments are processed and paid immediately after an application is approved. Payments are not withheld to satisfy prior USDA debts nor offset by Treasury.

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# **FSA Emergency Loans**

Loan Uses

- Restore or replace destroyed property
- Pay all or part of production costs associated with disaster year
- Pay family living
- Reorganize operation
- Refinance debts


